

## David Journet appointed Managing Director of NTL, an Alstom subsidiary

David Journet has been appointed Managing Director of NTL, a subsidiary of Alstom, as well as of Bpifrance, manufacturing Translohr rubber-tyred trams on its Duppigheim site and employing nearly 250 people. His new role will be to develop the commercial and industrial activity of NTL. He will take up the position on the 1st November.



A graduate of the 'Ecole de Management' in Strasbourg, David Journet began his career with Alstom in Belfort in 1997 before moving to the Reichshoffen site. His work in the transport and energy sectors has included various operational and management functions such as supply chain, procurement and production, covering projects involving gas turbines, TGV locomotives and power cars and regional trains. In 2012 he joined the Régiolis project in Reichshoffen as its Industrial Director.
